Introducing Sarah Parker-Walton



We are delighted to introduce you to Sarah Parker-Walton who has joined the leadership team at Green Meadows, working across all our sites until the end of the school year. Sarah is a SEND expert and an experienced school leader. She has written this message

Hello, my name is Sarah. I am really pleased to be currently working with the Senior Leadership Team at Green Meadows. I am from sunny Dorset and I started my

career in public houses and retail management. After starting a family, I then



worked for the ambulance service managing improvements to the service along with marketing.

At the age of 29, I changed career and trained as a secondary science teacher starting in special educational needs and challenging mainstream schools. I then moved to Bedale as a secondary science teacher delivering biology, chemistry and physics whilst contributing to the PE department after studying a sport science degree. Being passionate about developing young people's personal skills and social and emotional preparation for post 16, I led pastorally as Head of Year and for teaching and learning as Head of General Studies in a mainstream.

Nearly 10 years ago, I joined Forest Moor School a specialist social, emotional and mental health provision, as a senior leader leading the school's culture to embrace relational practice and the understanding of supporting social and emotional development through current research. My experience includes managing change in and out of education and extensive experience both pastorally and in teaching and learning. As an experienced SENCO my passion is in



understanding the needs of staff and pupils and empowering them to make progress both academically and equally, socially and emotionally, in preparation for life.
